Robert Morris Park

New sand was purchased for beach area to control weeds and help with E.coli levels.

Wenke Softball Complex

Joe and Rachel assembled new bleachers for the complex. Bleachers are now to code at all four diamonds.

David McMorrow donated \$10,000 from the Donald Myer Trust specifically to "supplement those funds allocated for the Adult Softball Program". Mr. Myer was a long-time participant of our league and left a lasting impact on our program. This financial donation in his memory was used to purchase field tarps for all four diamonds.

Merrill Park

We entered into our agreement with Brussee/Brady for the renovation project at Merrill Park. Brussee/Brady is a construction company out of Three Rivers. They have until September 15, 2019 to complete the project.

On June 2nd the Township Board approved the bid for the new restroom building at Merrill Park. Brussee/ Brady was awarded the contract. The total cost of the project is \$134,900.

Celery Street Park

Friday May 21st and Saturday June 1st we installed the new equipment at Celery Street Park purchased through a GameTime Sinclair recreation grant. The Comstock Fire Department, Township Board members, and staff all volunteered.
