Summer Safety

With summer around the corner, we're excited for the nicer weather. However, we also want to make sure everyone is prepared for potential severe weather. So, we grabbed some tips from Ready.gov.

Extreme Heat

Extreme Heat is defined as temperatures above 90 degrees for two or more days. For times like this, you need to remember:

- Know the signs of <u>heat illness</u>, such as Heat Stroke, Heat Cramps, and Heat Exhaustion
 - Heat Cramps and Heat Exhaustion can be treated by cooling the person down and giving sips of a sports drink or water
 - If someone is suffering from heat stroke, call 911 or get them to a hospital ASAP. Cool them down with whatever you can, but DO NOT GIVE THEM ANYTHING TO DRINK
- Don't rely on fans as your primary cooling device. They may make you more comfortable, but they don't reduce your body temperature.
- Identify place, such as libraries, shopping malls or cooling centers, to cool off if you need to
- Cover your windows with drapes, shades, or window reflectors to reflect heat outside

Thunderstorms and Lightning

Lightning is the leading cause of weather-related injury and death. Thunderstorms can also potentially cause winds of over 50 mph, hail, flash flooding, and tornadoes.

- Go indoors or get into a car with a roof immediately.
- Avoid using electrical devices that are plugged into an outlet.
- Do not drive through floodwater
- Watch for fallen trees or power lines and if you see one:
 - Call 911 FIRST
 - Call Consumers at 800-477-5050
 - Call the Road Commission of Kalamazoo County regarding downed trees during business hours.

Below are deadlines to keep in mind as we approach the August 2nd Primary Election.

Last day to register to vote in any manner other than in-person with the local Clerk.

Register to vote in-person with proof of residency with the local Clerk only.

Up to 5:00 pm - Voters may obtain an absent voter ballot via First Class mail. Up to 5:00 pm - Voters may submit a written request to spoil their absent voter ballot to receive a new ballot by mail.

8:00am – 4:00pm – Clerk's office is open to register voters and issue absent voter ballots.

Up to 10:00am - Voters who have returned their absent voter ballot may submit a written request in person to spoil their absent voter ballot and receive a new ballot in the Clerk's office.

Up to 4:00pm - Voters may obtain a voter ballot in person at the Clerk's office.

Up to 4:00pm - Voters who have lost their absent voter ballot or not yet received their ballot in the mail may submit a written request in person to spoil their absent voter ballot and receive a new ballot in the Clerk's office.

Up to 4:00pm - Emergency absentee voting.

Up to 8:00pm - Election Day registrants may obtain and vote an absent voter ballot in person in the Clerk's office or vote in person in the proper precinct.

Federal Funding Awarded for Fire Department Traffic Signal Preemption Devices in Comstock Township

The Road Commission of Kalamazoo County (RCKC) announced that they were approved for federal funding through the Michigan Department of Transportation (MDOT) in the amount of \$333,000. This funding is the first of its kind in Michigan to be awarded for this type of Highway Safety Improvement Program project to an agency. The RCKC was notified of the award on December 2, 2020. The project, approved for fiscal year 2022, is a collaborative effort between the RCKC and Comstock Township.

The devices use Global Positioning System (GPS) tracking to communicate to the traffic signals to adjust traffic patterns, essentially flushing out the area to give the fire department improved response times, improved safety, and reduced liability. This means when a Comstock Township fire truck or emergency response vehicle approaches the upgraded signal the light would be shifted to green for them and cross-traffic would be halted. This would reduce both head-on and side-impact crashes.

"What really drove [me] to pursue this technology in the Township is the limited sight intersections along Sprinkle Road," shared Matt Beauchamp, Fire Chief for Comstock Township. "We regularly cross Sprinkle Road for emergency responses and many times motorists on Sprinkle Road are caught by surprise when we approach an intersection. Our Township Superintendent, Scott Hess, worked with us to secure funding and our Township board unanimously voted in support of the project. The project calls for all signal-controlled intersections in the Township, including our borders, and all department owned vehicles to be outfitted with the technology." In addition to reduced collisions and emergency response times, the technology is expected to save wear and tear on department vehicles by minimizing aggressive stops and turns at signal-controlled intersections.

"Introducing this new technology and partnering with the Comstock Township Fire Department for implementation is another innovative and collaborative attempt by RCKC to promote safety on our roadways in Kalamazoo County," states Jim Hoekstra, RCKC Traffic and Project Engineer. "We hope that showcasing this technology and the benefits to safety and improved responsiveness with Comstock Township may lead to other emergency service implementations in the county." The scope of work for the grant includes the installation of the signal upgrade at 20 signals in Comstock Township and 15 vehicle kits for emergency response vehicles. Because the funding is awarded for fiscal year 2022 the construction will not begin until that year. Impacts to traffic during construction are expected to be minimal.

DINO-sized fun for the little ones!




