Last minute Registration

You can register to vote at the Comstock Township Office, located at 6138 King Highway, up until 8 p.m. on Election Day.

To register after October 24th, you are required to provide proof of residency. Valid proof of residency can be Michigan driver's license or state ID with current address, Michigan driver's license without current address and an additional proof of residency such as a utility bill or government check.

Winter property tax bills will be mailed out by December 1, 2022, and tax amounts become due and payable on that date. To avoid a 3% penalty, tax payments must be received by 5:00 p.m. on February 14, 2023. Payments can be made by mail, in-person at the Township office, by using the drop box located near our front entrance, or online at www.comstockmi.gov. We accept cash, check, money order, electronic check (\$3 fee), and major credit cards (3% fee). Any payments not received by February 28, 2023, will be turned over as delinquent to the Kalamazoo County Treasurer.

Curious about where your tax dollars go? Head to www.comstockmi.gov and navigate to the Treasurer's page. There you will find summer and winter property tax information sheets that detail when each millage was created, when it expires, and what it's used for.

Comstock's New Centenarian

Kenneth Dunlap is turning 100 on Wednesday, November 2nd, 2022. Kenneth has spent most of his life in Comstock.

As a boy, Kenneth went to school in a coal heated wooden school house. His father worked on the interurban and the family leased an orchard near their home on North 30th street. Additionally the family raised chickens and cows. His mother sold eggs during the great depression.

Kenneth says he spent most of his free time hanging out with other boys by a dance hall on Joe Io Island. "It was the place to hang," Kenneth said.

He also remembers fighting fires on his family's orchard. Occasionally when trains passed, sparks from coal could catch in the orchard, then Kenneth would be out fighting the fire on a horse drawn wagon.

During high school, Kenneth earned 15 varsity letters in baseball, basketball, track, and football. "I was always an athlete," Kenneth said. He was inducted into Comstock High School's hall of fame in 2013.

After graduation, Kenneth was drafted to serve in the Army during the Second World War. He served in the South Pacific and Japan, working to keep troops safe from mosquitos and malaria. His brothers served in both the Navy and Marines during World War 2 among a number of other young men from Comstock. His sister, Lt. Helen Dunlap, served as a WAC in the second world war

Upon returning, Kenneth worked as a union carpenter and on the family orchard, working 12 hours a days to do so. His family sold apple cider at a stand outside of their home, sometimes earning as much as \$100 on a weekend.

Training Grant

Comstock Fire & Rescue received the Assistance to Firefighters Grant for the Fiscal Year 2021, in the amount of \$117,321.14, with a 5% department match. This award will allow us to provide advanced incident command training and

health & safety officers training for all members. The training will be a combination of classroom and simulation labs. During the incident command training, students will be able to practice their skills utilizing computer technology for simulated fires. By allowing multiple participants to practice together, it will provide more "life like" scenarios. The health and safety officer training will ensure all of our members understand risk management principles related to the fireground and the station. Through this grant, the cost of the course, training aids, instructor time and personnel time is all included.

Important Election Dates

Voter Registration

- October 24th- Last day to register online or anywhere other than in person at your Clerk's office to vote in this election.
- October 25th through 8:00 PM November 8th- In person registration at your Clerk's office with ID and proof of residency.
- November 8th from 7:00 AM to 8:00 PM- In person registration and voting available on Election Day with ID and proof of residency.
- Proof of residency- Michigan driver's license or state ID with current address, Michigan driver's license without current address and an additional proof of residency such as a utility bill or lease.

Absent Voter Ballots

- November 4th by 5:00 PM- Deadline for Clerks to mail an absentee ballot. After this date, residents will need to request a ballot in person.
- November 7th by 4:00 PM- Deadline to obtain an Absent Voter Ballot in person or obtain a new Absent Voter Ballot in person or obtain a new Absent Voter Ballot if your ballot was lost in the mail or you never received it.
- November 7 by 4 PM- Deadline to request in writing to spoil your Absent Voter Ballot.

Special Hours

- Saturday November 5th 8:00 AM- 4:00 PM- The Clerk's office will be open to assist residents with obtaining Absent Voter Ballot and registering to vote.
- Election Day- November 8 by 4:00 PM- Emergency Absentee voting is available.
