This spring's curbside pickup will begin on Monday, May 8th. We expect crews will be done within 2 weeks, but they will take all the time they need to get to every street once. All items must be put out on Saturday, May 6th, or Sunday, May 7th. Any items not put out by then will not be picked up.

Though we still have several months to go before curbside pickup begins, the Township wanted you to be aware of the date to ensure you could begin looking to see what you want removed in May. We have a flyer at the back of this newsletter that lists what is accepted and what isn't accepted for curbside pickup.

2023 has exciting things in store for our community. Comstock Cemetery is expanding! We're close to running out of burial space and the expansion will create 1280 more plots, 384 being smaller cremation plots. Parks & Rec is also considering options to add a park next to the new section of the cemetery. Some ideas they're considering are a new playground, a dog park, a skate park or a pickleball court. No decisions have been made at this time as they are gathering ideas and input from the community.

Maple Grove cemetery will see a columbarium by the end of this year. Columbariums are a cost effective way to inter and memorialize loved one's cremains (cremation remains). The columbarium is in production and is scheduled to be delivered by the end of October.

Winter property tax season is wrapping up. As a reminder, payments must be received in our office by 5:00 p.m. on February 14 to avoid a 3% penalty. Payments can be made by mail; inperson at the Township office; by using the drop box located near our front entrance; or online at www.comstockmi.gov. We accept cash, check, money order, electronic check (\$3 fee), or major credit card (3% fee). Postmarks are accepted if payment is received by February 21, and the Township is not responsible for lost mail or mail delays.

Please note, we do not send reminder bills for unpaid taxes. It is highly recommended that all taxpayers take a moment to verify that both seasons have been fully paid. This is particularly important if your summer payment was received after September 14, as there may be interest charges owing. On March 1, all unpaid property taxes are turned over to the Kalamazoo County Treasurer as delinquent.

Comstock Fire & Rescue CPR Classes

Starting in January, Comstock Fire Department began holding monthly community CPR classes.

We are excited to introduce this community outreach program and encourage all who are interested to consider signing up.

While we introduce this program and evaluate the interest and demand for training, we are limiting the initial class size to 8. Participants will be chosen on a first-come, first-serve basis, with initial preference given to Comstock Township residents, so please do not hesitate to register.

CPR cards will not be issued for this program due to the limited scope of instruction. For this reason, this training is being provided at no cost!

Our overarching goal is to train as many people in our community as possible in how to properly provide chest compressions and use an AED in the event of a cardiac emergency.

Bystander CPR keeps blood moving to the brain and other organs to give victims of sudden cardiac arrest the best chance of survival possible while waiting for emergency services.

Classes will be held once a month at Comstock Fire Station 9-1 (1960 River Street) on Saturdays, 9:00 am – 11:00 am. We will announce upcoming classes on our Facebook page, so make sure you are following us to stay informed.

Comstock Cemetery Expansion

An expansion of Comstock Cemetery will be completed this year, offering 1280 more plots, 384 of those being smaller cremation-only plots. The expansion will extend into the old ball diamonds on Neal St. The new entrance will be off Neal St and the current entrance will be closed. With very few plots left in the current cemetery, the expansion will benefit our community for a long time to come and will also offer more affordable, smaller cremation-only plots as cremations become increasingly popular.





Columbarium at Maple Grove Cemetery

A 64-niche columbarium (cremation wall) is scheduled to be installed at Maple Grove Cemetery by the end of October 2023. The columbarium will offer families a cost-effective way to inter their loved one's cremains. Below is a rendering of a wall similar to the one that will be erected. Comstock Township OM UNIT. Spring Curbside Pickup 2023



Dates and Policies

- Spring Curbside Pickup begins <u>May 8th</u>.
- Clean-up is for residents that live within Comstock Township's limits only.
- · All items must be put out on May 6th or May 7th. Any items not put out by then will not be picked up.
- We hope pickup will be completed within 2 weeks, but pickup will go until crews have reached each street once.
- Crews <u>WILL NOT</u> return to areas for items placed after specified dates listed.

The following items are accepted

- Household doors and windows, furniture, carpeting, toys, miscellaneous rubbish/junk, and packaging
- Limit 4 cubic yards
- Glass should be in a cardboard box or other sturdy container and taped shut
- Mattresses/Box Springs MUST be wrapped in plastic
- Nothing will be accepted that 2 people cannot safely pick up and place into a truck
- No plastic bags
- Loose items must be in boxes

The following items will NOT be accepted

- Hot Tubs
- Boats that have been cut up
- Concrete, Blocks, Bricks
- Freon appliances such as refrigerators
- Freezers and dehumidifiers
- Electronics including computers, printers, monitors, and accessories
- Televisions
- Auto parts or engines
- Tires

- Batteries
- Florescent light bulbs
- Chemicals, paints, solvents, pesticides, herbicides
- Other household hazardous waste
- Iron or steel or cast-iron bathtubs
- Stumps, yard debris, brush
- Medical waste
- Oil, Gasolines or antifreeze

Consumers Concrete and the Kalamazoo County Hazardous Waste Center can handle disposal of some of these items. Contact them for more of that information.
