The Presidential Primary election will take place on Tuesday, February 27th. For those on the Permanent Ballot List, you will be sent a party selection form. Though voters do not register with political parties in the State of Michigan, voters must select a party-specific primary ballot. This does not commit you to a particular party forever, just for this election. The Republican and Democratic parties are the two parties who participate in the Primary, so you'll have a choice between the two parties or you can select a non- partisan ballot, which will have only proposals on it (if there are any). Residents who vote in precincts during the nine days of early voting or on election day will also be required to select a party ballot on their application to vote.

Winter property tax bills have been mailed out and tax amounts are now due and payable. To avoid a 3% penalty, tax payments must be received by 5:00 p.m. on February 14, 2024. Payments can be made by mail; in-person at the Township office; by using the drop box located at the east end of the parking lot; or online at www.comstockmi.gov. We accept cash, check, money order, electronic check (\$3 fee), and major credit cards (3% fee). When paying online, we also accept PayPal, Venmo, Google Pay, and Apple Pay (3% fee for each). Any payments not received by February 29, 2024, will be turned over as delinquent to the Kalamazoo County Treasurer.

Remember!

As you drive past one of our 3 Fire Stations, remember to be safe this holiday season!





Winter holidays are a time for families and friends to get together. But that also means a greater risk for fire. Following a few simple tips will ensure a happy and fire-safe holiday season.

HOLIDAY DECORATING

- Be careful with holiday decorations. Choose decorations that are flame resistant or flame retardant.
- Keep lit candles away from decorations and other things that can burn.
- Some lights are only for indoor or outdoor use, but not both.
- Replace any string of lights with worn or broken cords or loose bulb connections. Read manufacturer's instructions for number of light strands to connect.
- Use clips, not nails, to hang lights so the cords do not get damaged.
- Keep decorations away from windows and doors.

HOLIDAY ENTERTAINING

- Test your smoke alarms and tell guests about your home fire escape plan.
- Keep children and pets away from lit candles.
- Keep matches and lighters up high in a locked cabinet.
- Stay in the kitchen when cooking on the stovetop.
- Ask smokers to smoke outside. Remind smokers to keep their smoking materials with them so young children do not touch them.
- Provide large, deep ashtrays for smokers. Wet cigarette butts with water before discarding.



Before Heading Out or to Bed

Blow out lit candles when you leave the room or go to bed. Turn off all light strings and decorations before leaving home or going to bed.

FACTS

- 1 More than **one-third** of home decoration fires are started by candles.
- ! More than two of every five decoration fires happen because decorations are placed too close to a heat source.

As you deck the halls this holiday season, be fire smart. A small fire that spreads to a Christmas tree can grow large very quickly.



PICKING THE TREE

 Choose a tree with fresh, green needles that do not fall off when touched.



PLACING THE TREE

- Before placing the tree in the stand, cut 2" from the base of the trunk.
- Make sure the tree is at least three feet away from any heat source, like fireplaces, radiators, candles, heat vents or lights.
- Make sure the tree is not blocking an exit.
- Add water to the tree stand. Be sure to add water daily.



LIGHTING THE TREE

- Use lights that are listed by a qualified testing laboratory. Some lights are only for indoor or outdoor use.
- Replace any string of lights with worn or broken cords or loose bulb connections. Read manufacturer's instructions for number of light strands to connect.
- Never use lit candles to decorate the tree.
- Always turn off Christmas tree lights before leaving home or going to bed.

After Christmas

Get rid of the tree after Christmas or when it is dry. Dried-out trees are a fire danger and should not be left in the home or garage, or placed outside against the home.

Check with your local community to find a recycling program.

Bring outdoor electrical lights inside after the holidays to prevent hazards and make them last longer.

FACTS

- ! Almost one third of home Christmas tree fires are caused by electrical problems.
- (!) Although Christmas tree fires are not common, when they do occur, they are more likely to be serious.
- ! A heat source too close to the tree causes more than **one in every five** of the fires.





Voting Information Page 10 VOTE

Michigan voters overwhelmingly passed Proposal 2022-2 in November of 2022, including the majority of Comstock voters. Proposal 2022-2 brings a number of changes to voting laws which will be in effect in the 2024 elections. One of the big changes you'll see is nine days of in-person early voting before Statewide and Federal elections. Voters can vote and run their ballots through tabulators, though results will not be tallied until election night. Please keep in mind that once your ballot is in the tabulator, there is no way to change your vote, even if your candidate drops out after you cast a ballot.

Another major aspect of Proposal 2022-2 affects those who are on the Absent Voter Application list and are used to receiving an application for a ballot prior to every election. Moving forward you will need to select to be on the "Permanent Ballot List", which means you'll automatically receive a ballot instead of an application every election. If you do not select this option, you can still vote absentee but will have to initiate a request for an Absent Voter ballot or vote in the polls.
