- Curbside Pickup begins at the end of next month. As you think about what you'd like to throw out, please review items we can and cannot accept. The following items are accepted:
- Household doors and windows, furniture, carpeting, toys, miscellaneous rubbish/junk, and packaging.
- Limit 4 cubic yards.
- Glass should be in a cardboard box or other sturdy container and taped shut.
- Mattresses/Box Springs MUST be wrapped in plastic.
- Nothing will be accepted that 2 people cannot safely pick up and place into a truck.
- No plastic bags or loose items must be in boxes.

There are also items not accepted during curbside pickup, we have a list of those online.

The assessor has mailed out the 2024 assessment notices and they should be hitting your mailbox soon. If you want to appeal your values, please see the notice for March Board of Review information including dates and times. Water and sewer special assessment bills will be sent out in April and will be due by August 1. Any amounts not paid by November 1 will be added to the winter tax bill.

### Get a Car Seat Checked

We all want our children to travel safely in cars. Installing a car seat for younger children and babies can be a challenge. Comstock Fire & Rescue has certified child passenger safety (CPS) technicians through the Safe Kids Coalition who can check to make sure your car seats are installed correctly and teach you how to use and install a car seat on your own.

Comstock Fire will be hosting a Safe Kids Car Seat Safety event on Wednesday, March 27th from 4:00 p.m. to 7:00 p.m. at Station 9-1 (1960 River Street). Trained technicians will teach you everything you need to know to make sure your car seat is installed and used correctly.

If you are not able to attend the Car Seat Safety event in March, we also provide installations by appointment. Please contact Fire Marshal Mike Kessler at 269-345-9244 or email him at mkessler@comstockmi.gov to schedule an appointment.

There are a few things you should know before you meet with a CPS technician. This isn't like getting an oil change on your car, where you leave the car and go do something else. Working with a CPS technician will be a one-on-one learning experience. When you leave, you should be confident that your child's seat is installed correctly and feel comfortable reinstalling it on your own. This may be the most important thing you learn.

#### Before the Car Seat Checkup

Be prepared to learn, not just watch the CPS technician install the car seat. They're trained to teach you.

- Know your child's current weight and height.
- Using the car seat instruction manual and the vehicle owner's manual, try to install the car seat into your vehicle before your appointment.
- Tip! Check the index of your vehicle owner's manual for "child safety seats."
- Be sure to bring the car seat instruction manual AND the vehicle owner's manual with you to your appointment.
- If possible, bring your child with you as well as another caregiver to help while you are learning.
- Be prepared to learn. The CPS Technician is trained to educate you to install and use your car seat properly in your vehicle.

#### **During the Car Seat Checkup**

This one-on-one education typically takes 20-30 minutes, depending on your car seat and vehicle. The technician will take all the time you need until you feel comfortable that your car seat is used and installed correctly:

- During the checkup, a CPS Technician will:
  - Fill out a car seat check form to document the process (including car seat type, location in the vehicle, misuse observations, etc.). The form may be electronic or on paper.
  - Review car seat selection appropriate for your child's age, weight, and height as well as review factors that affect proper use.
  - Review the car seat instruction manual and the vehicle owner's manual to ensure that both are being followed correctly.
  - Ensure that an appropriate seating position in the vehicle is being used.
  - Check the car seat for recalls, visible damage, and expiration date.
  - Guide your installation of the car seat. You are encouraged to ask to learn how to install the car seat in different seating positions with different installation techniques.
  - Discuss the next steps for your child, such as when to move to the next type of car seat.
  - Answer any questions you may have, so ask away.



## **Community CPR Class**

Our next Community CPR training session will be offered on Saturday, March 23rd, at 9 AM.

We are excited to continue this community outreach program and encourage all who are interested to consider signing up. Participants will be contacted in the order they sign up, with preference given to Comstock Township residents. Please do not hesitate to sign up, as the first eight Comstock residents to sign up will be contacted for confirmation first. Vacancies created by cancelations will be filled using the order of the list. People from outside the township will be contacted if we are unable to confirm eight Comstock township residents in a timely manner.

\*\*\* If you have a disability that requires special assistance (i.e., hearing-impaired/deaf and needing an ASL interpreter), please specify when filling out the registration form attached to this post. Because coordinating special resources takes time, any need for accommodation must be submitted at least 2 weeks before the day of class. Every effort will be made, but nothing can be guaranteed due to a shortage of interpreters and other local resources.

One registration form must be filled out for each person planning to attend. For example, a family of three would need to submit three separate forms, not three names on one form.

CPR cards will not be issued for this program due to the limited scope of instruction. This class is based on the American Heart Association's Family and Friends CPR curriculum. Since no cards are issued, this training is provided for FREE!

The class will be held at Comstock Fire Station 9-1, (1960 River Street, Kalamazoo, MI 49048) on Saturday, March 23rd, 9:00 am – 11:00 am.


