Shall Galesburg-Augusta Community Schools, Kalamazoo County, Michigan, borrow the sum of not to exceed Eleven Million Two Hundred Forty Thousand Dollars (\$11,240,000) and issue its general obligation unlimited tax bonds therefor, in one or more series, for the purpose of:

remodeling school buildings and facilities; equipping, re-equipping, furnishing and refurnishing school buildings and facilities; erecting a new transportation facility; acquiring, installing, equipping and re-equipping school buildings for instructional technology; and preparing, developing, improving and equipping structures, facilities and sites?

The following is for informational purposes only:

The estimated millage that will be levied for the proposed bonds in 2026 is 1.00 mill (\$1.00 on each \$1,000 of taxable valuation) for a 0.00 mill net increase over the prior year's levy. The maximum number of years the bonds of any series may be outstanding, exclusive of any refunding, is sixteen (16) years. The estimated simple average annual millage anticipated to be required to retire this bond debt is 2.00 mills (\$2.00 on each \$1,000 of taxable valuation).

The school district does not expect to borrow from the State to pay debt service on the bonds. The total amount of qualified bonds currently outstanding is \$25,535,000.
